Diversity is vital and central to our goals both in terms of the on-air staff we employ as well as the listener base that we cater to. The full portfolio of WUMB programming has broad appeal across a diverse geographic footprint, from our urban location in Boston to the rural areas of New England and the Northeast to the rest of the world through our online streams. We are dedicated to curating a variety of shows, including both music and talk, that matches up with the diversity we find in our community of listeners. We air a weekly public affairs program called "McCormack Speaks," which focuses on issues local to Massachusetts that otherwise do not get much coverage in mainstream media. We also produce and air "Odyssey," a world music program that brings a diverse selection of music from Africa, Asia, Latin America, and elsewhere to our listeners. To connect with the strong presence of Irish and Scottish heritage in Boston and New England, we produce and air "Celtic Twilight," which allows for traditional Celtic folk music to reach a modern audience. "Spinning the Blues" is a weekly show that focuses on the traditional and contemporary African American blues music. To augment our blues programming, we have a Blues Music Camp that provides hands on instruction to the musicians of our listener base, which helps us connect with one of the most vital forms of black expression. In addition, we hosted two weeks of our famous Summer Acoustic Music Week, which allowed for further instruction on traditionally black music forms as well as folk music forms from around the country and around the world.

Our location on campus at the University of Massachusetts Boston offers us unique opportunities to partner with educators and students in efforts both to teach and to learn. "McCormack Speaks" is produced by members of McCormack College who bring number of professors and other expert professionals in business and politics, including writers, researchers, lawmakers and more onto the show, providing our listeners with direct access to expert knowledge and insight on a broad array of topics. Another regular feature on air is a series of segments highlighting the faculty and students at UMass Boston, through a variety of educational topics and community events on campus. A core mission of WUMB is to support local music and local venues. To accomplish that goal, we partnered the Burren in Somerville, which hosts a monthly concert series called Third Thursday. These concerts, held on the third Thursday of every month, provide a way for our listeners to support the Burren directly and to connect local artists with local venues and local audiences, which helps to keep the local music scene active and vibrant. We also broadcast these concerts live on air to bring our Boston-based music to those who might have trouble going in person and to listeners around the globe through our online stream. We've been able to engage with various groups to offer education about how radio works. how radio works

Our partnerships with a variety of local music venues foster interconnectedness which contributes greatly to financially stronger and more stable businesses, higher quality live concerts, audience satisfaction and, overall, a more dynamic and active local music scene. Besides "tuning into the radio station", our listeners have the benefit of access to live music the station airs. The WUMB Member Concerts build community and strengthen the cultural ties that bring people together. Throughout the year, the regularly scheduled event connects our audience to music-oriented businesses. It's a win-win situation. The venues have seen an increase in patrons, not just for a scheduled Member Concert but throughout the year. The partnerships continue to be a viable way for our listeners to discover a great venue and return even when there isn't a Member Concert at one of the venues. Weekly ticket giveaways are another benefit of our partnerships that benefits our listeners who venture out into the community, rather than just listening to the radio. Airing the Right Source podcast is another way WUMB is helping to be a presence within the music industry.

We continue to air several weekly talk shows that engage with issues facing minority communities. We have a locally produced two-houl World Music program that plays music and highlights musicians from around the globe. Each week there is a segment focusing on Africa and Latin America included in the program. We also produce "Right Mind Media," a weekly podcast that focuses on addiction. "Right Mind" educates our listeners about addiction and engages in discussions with guests that include community leaders, public health professionals, writers, and researchers, as well as individuals who are willing to open about their own battles with addiction. The podcast helps to shed light on the opioid crisis that is currently affecting communities throughout the Boston area and New England, as well as to combat misinformation and misunderstandings in the general public, guided by the idea that a better-informed public will help individuals and communities fight for the health and safety of our most vulnerable citizens.

5. Please assess the impact that your CPB funding had on your ability to serve your community. What were you able to do with your grant that you wouldn't be able to do if you didn't receive it?

CPB funding has enabled WUMB to support a wide range of projects and content creation that ensures the realization of our goal to serve the community. Our weekly program, Folk Tales, a balanced mix of music selection and related educational content, continues to inform listeners about important figures and events in folk music history. CPB funding support the show has evolved into a popular weekly program with a enthusiastic and devoted listening audience. A notable extension of the program is the creation of free online access to over 300 hours of Folktales that are now available to educators, music historians etc... for download. Another benefit of the CPB funding is the opportunity to connect with other public radio networks beyond New England. Bringing diverse syndicated shows Mountain Stage(West Virginia; Etown/Colorado, Beale Street/Tennessee, World Cafe/Philadelphia and American Routes/Louisiana), from other regions in the country, allows us to bring more diverse weekly programming to our local-based listeners. Producing special features, such as Black History Month, International Women's Day and monthly presentations on the history of Blues and Folk music, that go beyond regular programming. Most importantly, the "special features" we are developing provide a way to continue presenting media content that our audience might not otherwise hear. The features we have developed and, want to continue to develop, are intended to broaden listener knowledge - engaging, educating, and building community which is central to the purpose and goal of public media.
